Situated on 23 lush acres in tony Litchfield County, Connecticut, the L-shaped home unites three components: the original two-story main building, a former barn (now the living room) and the connecting passageway Henderson transformed into a super-simple dining room. The latter two, along with a wing in the main structure containing the kitchen, family room and master bedroom suite, were added on about 20 years ago.

"The previous owner did a fantastic job on renovations," says Henderson.
